ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

1. Attendance of 75% in theory & practical/clinical is mandatory for adequate skill transfer in each subject.

Student falling short of attendance will be allowed to compensate if the shortage can be fulfilled prior to commencement of University Examinations. Failing which the student will not be issued hall ticket for examination.

2. Passing Criteria for Each Subject

- Internal Assessment (40%)
- Theory (50%)
- Practical (50%)
- Total (overall) (50 %)
 However each student has to secure the deficient passing internal assessment marks in the university examination to fulfill the overall passing criteria of each subject.



PROFESSIONAL ETHICS AND BEHAVIOR STANDARDS

Physiotherapy profession being an independent practice profession with self-regulatory norms gives professional autonomy to one's career. Hence all the students are obliged to adopt appropriate professional image and conduct during their undergraduate study period to gain patient confidence and to offer functional outcomes.

Discipline, moral attitude, punctuality, ethical clinical practice and professional conduct with humanity

are the prime requisites of our profession.

Institution General Rules & Regulations

Every student shall observe utmost discipline, decorum and proudly contribute to the academic ambience and reputation of the institution and our campus. Student should treat each other with dignity, spirit of friendship and brotherhood to create and nurture harmonious student community.

- 1. Regular college timings are 9.00am to 4.00pm .Students should report to college before 9.00 am.
- 2. Saturday will be half working day from 09.00 am to 01.00 pm for undergraduate students. Interns and Postgraduates shall have full working hours on Saturdays.
- 3. A grace time of 5 minutes will be allowed to a student entering late in clinics after which they will be marked late. Three late will be considered, as 1 day of absenteeism.
- 4. Any student who anticipates remaining absent due to foreseeable reason, should inform the respective class in charge & office staff in writing.
- 5. If the student is absent due to a medical reason, it should be informed to the respective class in-charge or the Principal. On the day of joining back, student **must** produce a medical certificate for their absence; and a letter from parent / guardian informing the Principal about the same. Medical Certificate will NOT be accepted later.
- 6. Every student should have mandatory 75% attendance in both lectures & practical/clinics separately. Students with less than 75% attendance will not be eligible to appear for University exam. Those students who have failed to attend on compulsory attendance days, taken leave without prior intimation and without a valid medical certificate will also have to compensate as instructed by the class in-charge.
- 7. When lectures are followed by clinics, students are required to reach the clinics within 10 minutes, after which they will be marked late for that particular practical or clinics.
- 8. Students should wear aprons with identity cards in the campus for all practical, clinical, classroom sessions & examinations.
- 9. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited during lectures, practical, clinics, symposiums/presentation & examination. Failure to comply with this rule will result in confiscation of the phone which will be returned only on course completion.
- 10. All the equipments, machines and clinical accessories should be handled with care by students. Any damage caused to the equipments, machines, clinical accessories, and institutional property due to negligence or deliberate mischief by the student(s), the cost of the damaged item with penalty fees will be recovered by the student(s) who indulge in such errant practices.
- 11. Students are required to report to college in the prescribed uniform as per guidelines of MGM Institute of Physiotherapy. Uniform comprises of blue shirt and black trousers with apron and formal shoes.

12. Personal grooming and dress code is very much essential for self-esteem and professionalism. Fancy accessories like long earrings, bracelets, watches are not allowed to wear in the institution. Boys hairstyle should be neat, well-groomed with clean shaven and Girls should tie their hair up neatly.

All students are expected to follow code of discipline. Students failing to maintain the above discipline will be given one warning. If the same behavior continues then appropriate action will be taken by the authority.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

 College timings may extend beyond the official working hours occasionally for academic/ co curricular activities. Students may require to stay beyond the working hours in those occasions to enrich their academic experience.

2. Attendance reports and performance reports are sent to parents each quarter and parents of students with lacunae may be asked to meet the year co-coordinator/ Principal for discussion.

3. Parents who wish to discuss any matter with faculty or designated authorities may take prior appointment and visit.

4. All parents by default are members of the Parents Teachers Association. Meetings of the same will be held bi annually with prior intimation.

5. Parents can communicate with elected members for each academic year and put forth their views which can be discussed in the next PTA with the permission of the chair.

6. Hostel facility is available for students residing at far off places.

ANTI-RAGGING

Ragging in any form is totally banned in the campus premises and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging are liable to punished under criminal offence. Anti-ragging committee is constituted for the purpose of enquiry into the incidents on ragging in our institution.


All our students and interns will be posted in this MGM Hospital to gain clinical exposure to treat various patients including state-of-the-art
