OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH HISTORY



- During <u>industrial revolution</u> in Europe: Many reports available on <u>disease</u> & <u>accidents</u> at workplace
- As a result <u>health services</u> for prevention & treatment of industrial injuries
- Late 19th & early 20th century legislation against to protect workers against occupational injury & diseases were introduced sporadically

WHAT IS OCCUPATION?




- 45% of world's belong to global workforce
- Economic & material basis of society which is critically dependent on their working capacity
- Occupational <u>health</u> & well-being of working people = productivity & are of utmost importance for overall <u>socioeconomic</u> & sustainable <u>development</u>

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH



Health status whether immediate or delayed as a result of primary occupation





OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH HAZARDS



- Workplace is a <u>hazardous</u>
- <u>Detrimental</u> effects on the health caused directly either by a part or wholly by elements of occupation



OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH HAZARDS



- Many individuals spend <u>one-third of their adult life</u> in such hazardous work environments.
- Approximately 30-50% of workers report hazardous risk factors at work place.
- 100 million occupational injuries causing 1 million death/year globally (WHO)
- Only 5- 10% of workers in developing countries
- 20-50% of workers in industrialized countries (with a very few exceptions) have access to occupational health services

OCCUPATIONAL ENVIRONMENT



Occupational environment is <u>sum</u> of the <u>external conditions</u> & <u>influences</u> which prevail at the place of work & which have a <u>bearing</u> on the health of working population


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

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

ECONOMY AS A WHOLE



Total payment of compensation from the occupational injuries estimated to be 18 crore in 2001.10 fold increase in 5 years
