The relevance of the syllabus was rated very good by 71.42% of respondents, with 28.58% rating it as good. In terms of learning value, 62.85% found it very good, and 37.15% rated it as good. The distribution of contact hours among course components received a very good rating from 62.85% of respondents, while 37.15% found it good. Textbooks and references were considered very good by 60% of the respondents and good by 40%. The evaluation scheme was rated very good by 60% and good by 40%. The distribution of the syllabus for terminal and preliminary exams was assessed as very good by 54.28% of respondents, and 45.72% found it good. Finally, the completion of the syllabus was rated very good by 65.71% and good by 34.29%.


Physiology

The relevance of syllabus units was rated very good by 62.07% and good by 37.93%. Learning value was seen as very good by 48.28% and good by 51.72%. Distribution of contact hours and textbooks were both rated very good by 48.28% and good by 51.72%. The evaluation scheme was rated very good by 55.17% and good by 44.83%. Syllabus distribution for exams received a very good rating from 51.72% and good from 48.28%. However, completion of the syllabus had a mixed review, with 37.93% rating it very good and 62.07% good.

Kinesiology


